1. Introduction

Parkdale Cromdale Community League, as part of Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues (EFCL) District 4, received a notice of the opportunity for a meeting with City of Edmonton Ward 7 Councillor, Tony Caterina. The purpose of the meeting with Councillor Caterina, to be held on January 18, 2018, was to identify interests, needs and concerns to help inform him of the current situation within Ward 7 from a District 4 perspective.

Parkdale Cromdale Community Leagues Neighbourhood Development Committee thought it might be valuable to have a meeting prior to share thoughts and determine what common as well as community-unique interests, needs and concerns there may be among District 4 members.

In late 2017, invitations were sent to community league leaders in EFCL District G and selected, adjacent community leagues of Boyle Street and McCauley. Representatives from 6 community leagues attended a meeting at the Parkdale Cromdale Community Centre in preparation for the meeting with Councillor Caterina and to share opportunities for collaboration and co-operation.

2. Shared and Unique Interests, Needs and Issues Among Participating Community Leagues

Everyone participated in a discussion of shared and unique interests, needs and concerns. Fourteen (14) items were raised during the meeting. The discussion is summarized in the table that follows:
